### **CHAPTER 3 - BUILDING CODES**

#### **ARTICLE 2 - NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE**

*Legislative History: Resolution No. 1569, adopting the National Electrical Code of 1965 and any revisions thereto, was enacted by the Papago Council on November 3, 1967.*

*Note: Unofficial resolution titles lists compiled by the Legislative Secretary's Office identify two additional codes enacted by the Papago Council, the Uniform Plumbing Code (Resolution No. 67-1565) and the Uniform Building Code (Resolution No. 67-1566). However, neither of these resolutions has been recovered; neither appears in the Secretary's Office archive or Bureau of Indian Affairs Papago Agency records.*

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1569

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council enacted Ordinance No. 1212, on January 5, 1962, chartering the Papago Tribal Housing Authority, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has advised the Tribal Housing Authority that applications for initial certification of workable programs for community development will not be accepted for processing unless the locality has in effect an electrical code, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has not previously adopted an electrical code, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council deems it necessary to adopt the National Electrical Code of 1965 (NFPA No. 70; ASA C1-1965), for the safeguarding of persons and of buildings and their contents from hazards arising from the use of electricity for light, heat, power, signaling and for other purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it hereby adopts the National Electrical Code of 1965 (NFPA No. 70; ASA C1-1965), and any revisions thereto, except and subject to such conditions and provisions of the code which because of physical conditions, are not feasible and cannot be met. It is the intention of the Papago Tribal Council that said code be in effect except for the aforementioned condition.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on November 3, 1967, with a vote of 19 for, 0 against, with 0 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Sections 2 (f), (a) and (h) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
