TITLE 15 - ENVIRONMENT

CHAPTER 3 - INTERIM PESTICIDE PROTOCOL

Legislative History: The "Interim Pesticide Control Protocol" was adopted by Resolution No. 02-558 on November 18, 2002.

Related Legislation: Resolution No. 02-558 was amended by Resolution No. 02-559 (to clarify that the Legislative Council Domestic Affairs Committee reviewed, but did not recommend approval of, the Interim Pesticide Control Protocol) on November 18, 2002.

TOHONO O'ODHAM NATION ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY PESTICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAM INTERIM PESTICIDE CONTROL PROTOCOL

- (I) Applicator Requirements
 - (A) <u>Certification</u>. All commercial applicators working within the Tohono O'odham Nation are required to hold a current applicator certification from the State of Arizona.
 - (B) <u>Business License</u>. All commercial applicators working within the Tohono O'odham Nation are required to obtain a business license from the Tohono O'odham Nation pursuant to the Transaction Privilege Tax Ordinance, No. 03-81 and its amendments.
 - (C) <u>Federal Laws</u>. The requirements of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act are applicable to all pesticide applications on the Tohono O'odham Nation.
- (II) <u>Duty to Notify</u>. All pesticide applicators are hereby charged with the duty to notify the Pesticide Program of the Tohono O'odham Nation Environmental Protection Agency of all applications of pesticides within the boundaries of the lands of the Nation.
 - (A) Exempted Applications.
 - (1) This section shall not apply to persons applying pesticides in their own residences.
 - (2) This section shall not apply to a pesticide product deployed in the form of a self-contained bait or trap, to gel or paste deployed as a crack and crevice treatment, to any pesticide exempted from regulation by the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act [7 U.S.C. 136 et seq.or to antimicrobial pesticides, including sanitizers and disinfectants.

(III) Notification.

(A) Pre-Application Notification. The applicator shall submit prior written notice, via fax, U.S. mail, or hand delivery as long as it is received at least 24 hours before the application of pesticides. Shorter notice may be provided if necessary, upon prior written

approval by the TONEPA.

- (1) Form. The notice shall include at a minimum all of the information included on the attached "Pesticide Application Pre-Notification Form." See Attachment A. Other forms may be used upon prior written approval by the TONEPA.
- (2) <u>Current Labels.</u> It is the responsibility of the applicator to monitor changes in the pesticide labels for the products they are applying. The applicator shall provide to the TONEPA a copy of the actual current label for the product being applied as part of the pre-application notification. If the label is unchanged since last submitted to TONEPA, it is not necessary to submit a duplicate. If the label has changed, a copy of the updated label must be provided to TONEPA prior to the application.
- (3) Regular or Recurring Applications. If an applicator provides regular scheduled applications to predetermined sites, a copy of the schedule and list of sites may be submitted in lieu of separate pre-notifications for each application, upon written approval by the TONEPA. This does not exempt such applicator from providing current labels for each pesticide used as described in (III)(A)(2) above
- (B) Post Application Report.
 - (1) <u>Purpose</u>: To provide information on what pesticides were actually used, the amount, and the conditions at the site at the time of application.
 - (2) <u>Post-Application Report</u>. The applicator shall provide a post-application report to the TONEPA within 10 calendar days after an application.
 - (3) <u>Forms</u>. Applicators are encouraged to use existing forms, such as those already required by the State of Arizona, to reduce administrative burden. For example:
 - (a) For Agricultural (aerial & non-aerial) applications, the completed Form 1080 may be submitted. See Attachment B for a sample.
 - (b) For Structural Applications, a copy of the invoice. See Attachment C for a sample.
 - (c) Site Pre-Treatment for termites and other pests. A copy of the tag similar to the one in Attachment D shall be provided to the TONEPA.

- (V) <u>Observations</u>. The TON Pesticide Program is available on a limited basis to observe applications as they occur, to determine whether the application is being conducted correctly. These observations shall:
 - (A) Be conducted at the written request of the person who originally ordered the application or the applicator (see attached form),
 - (B) Require at least 24 hours prior notice to the Pesticide Program for scheduling purposes
 - (C) Not be considered to be regulatory inspections,
 - (D) Result in an Observation Report to be submitted by the Tohono O'odham Nation Pesticide Program to the person who ordered the application.
- (VI) <u>Effective Date</u>. This Interim Pesticide Control shall be effective immediately upon approval by the Nation
- (VII) Definitions: The following words used in this Interim Protocol have the following meanings:
 - (A) "Application of a pesticide" means the application of pesticide product on to an area for the purpose of preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest.
 - (B) "Applicator" means any person who applies pesticides...including commercial and non-commercial applications, but excluding the application of pesticides by a person at their own residence.
 - (C) "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation.
 - (D) "Lands of the Nation" means all lands within the territorial jurisdiction of the Nation, whether or not the Nation has an ownership interest in the land, including but not limited to tribal trust land, allotted land, patented land, homesteads, leased land, and rights of way. Included within the territorial jurisdiction of the Nation are the lands established by the following Executive Orders: December 12, 1882, modified by June 17, 1909 (Gila Bend); July 1, 1874 (San Xavier); February 1, 1917 (Sells); and the following Acts of Congress: the Act of February 21, 1931 (Sells); the Act of September 10, 1978 (Florence); and such other lands as may have been or may hereafter be added thereto by

purchase, gift, Act of Congress or otherwise.

- (E) "Nation" means the Tohono O'odham Nation, a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized under a constitution adopted by the Nation on January 18, 1986 and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs(Operations) on March 6, 1986 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.987, 25 U.S.C. §476)
- (F) "Pesticide" means (I) any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest, (2) any substance or mixture of substances intended for use as a plant regulator, defoliant, or desiccant, and (3) any nitrogen stabilizer.
