CHAPTER 4 - RECREATION PERMITS

ARTICLE 1 - NONMEMBER HUNTING PERMITS

Legislative History: Ordinance No. 32, governing the issuance of hunting permits to nonmembers, was enacted by the Papago Council on April 4, 1958 and approved by the Papago Agency Superintendent on April 11, 1958.

Related History: Ordinance No. 32 was suspended by Resolution No. 15-148, "Suspending 19 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 4, Article 1 - Nonmember Hunting Permits and Establishing Moratorium on Hunting by Nonmembers" effective May 15, 2015 until May 17, 2017.

- 1. A Tribal hunting license shall cost (10.00) It may be issued at any time but shall expire on time 30 of each year. It will penalt thehunting of all wild foul and gives, consist mountain alway, all species of deer, and invaling. It shall be increased subject to the following conditions to which licensue agrees:
 - e. In addition to carrying a tribal hunting liceme on the person while hunting, licemes must also have in his possession a valid Arizona State hunting licemes.
 - b. To comply with all Federal and State gome leve and Papago bag limits.
 - e. To comply with all Federal laws prohibiting the introduction, sale, possession, gift, or manufacture of alcoholic drinks on Indian Reservations.
 - d. To refrain from abouting in the vicinity of my house, village, person, or livestock.
 - e. To respect the rights of others.
 - f. To obtain permission from the emer before musting on fenced allotments within the San Kayler resorration.
 - g. The license is not transferable.

Any person violating any provisions of this ordinace shall have his hunting license cancelled. Such person shall also be decred a traspassor on the range Reservation pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 1 of the Penson Tribal Law and Crear Code, and in addition shall also be required to surrender any goos in thair possession.
