CHAPTER 1 - FINANCE CODE

ARTICLE 6 - SIGNATURES AND BANK ACCOUNTS

Legislative History: Resolution No. 190-88 "Reauthorizing Opening Of and Withdrawals from Bank Accounts" was passed by the Council on July 15, 1988 and vetoed by the Nation's Chairman on July 18, 1988; veto was overridden by Resolution No. 191-88 on July 19, 1988; signature authority was amended by Resolution No. 06-466 "Directing Development of Finance Code and Authorizing Officials to Sign Negotiable Instruments on the Nation's Behalf" effective July 13, 2006.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Reauthorizing Opening Of and Withdrawals from Bank Accounts)

RES. NO.190-88

WHEREAS, under the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Hation the Treasurer of the Tohono O'odham Nation is charged with the acceptance, receipt and safekeeping of all tribal funds, and with the deposit of such funds as directed by the Legislative Council; and

WHEREAS, the Treasurer's position has been vacant for over a year, the Legislative Council did by Res. No. 189-88 establish the position of Chief Financial Officer with prescribed duties and responsibilities "for receiving, safekeeping and disbursement of the Nation's funds. Also responsible for protecting the Nation's interest in all financial matters."

HOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislative Council that the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to open and maintain such checking, savings or other banking accounts in the name and on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, until further order of this Council, any funds of the Tohono O'odham Nation deposited in such accounts be subject to withdrawal or charge at any time upon checks, notes, drafts, bills of exchange, acceptances, undertakings or other instruments or orders for the payment when made, signed, drawn, accepted, or endorsed on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation by any two of the following officers, namely the Chief Financial Officer, the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Nation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary or any other officer of
the Legislative Council from time to time in office is
authorized to verify the names of the officers of the
Legislative Council and Executive Department and their
respective offices, together with specimens of their

signatures, and in case of any change of any holder or holders of any such office or offices, the fact of such change and the names of any new officers and the offices respectively held by them, together with specimens of their signatures.

The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 15th day of July , 1988 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 04 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (d) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Peputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee of the Legislature, (the Committee), presented a report to the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, (the Legislature), containing certain recommendations concerning the condition and status $\circ f$ the Tohono O'odham Nation's Financial System; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature, by the enactment of Resolutions Ho.

188-86, 189-88, and 190-88 did approve of the recommendations presented by the Committee; and

WHEREAS, upon presentation of Resolutions 198-88, 189-88, and 190-88 to the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Mation he did disapprove thereof and returning it to the Council with his objections in accordance with provisions of Article VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Mation; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Council has reviewed the Chairman's objections and a written rebuttal prepared by the Committee, (see attached "Budget and Finance Committee's response to the Veto of resolutions 188-88, 189-88, and 190-88); and

WHEREAS, after full consideration, the Legislative Council again voted to pass Resolutions No. 188-88, 189-88, and 190-88.

HOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, does hereby override the Chairman's veto of Resolutions No. 188-88, 189-88, and 190-88, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast, 1,020.0.

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RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Directing Development of Finance Code and Authorizing Officials to Sign Negotiable Instruments on the Nation's Behalf)

RESOLUTION NO. 06-466

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Tohono O'odham Legislative
2	·	Councilwithbroadlegislativeandfiscalpowers, includingthepower"tomanageany

6	WHEREAS,	the Nation's Chairperson is vested by Article VII, Section 2 of the Constitution with the
7		power to "oversee the implementation of all laws, ordinances, resolutions and rules
8		made by the Tohono O'odham Council, "to "exercise all other powers delegated to him
9		by the Tohono O'odham Council," and to "oversee the administration and
10		management of the government in accordance with an administrative plan adopted
11		by the Tohono O'odham Council" (Constitution, Article VII, Section 2(c), (d), and (a));

13	WHEREAS,	although the Legislative Council Budget and Finance Committee is in the process of
14		developing a Finance Code that will clarify the power of various Nation's officials to
15		execute contracts, sign other documents and instruments, and to exercise certain
16		fiscal powers, current law requires that any funds deposited in the Nation's accounts
17		be subject to withdrawal or charge upon checks or other instruments "when made,
18		$signed, drawn, accepted, or endorsed on behalf of the {\bf Tohono}O'odhamNationbyany$
19		two of the following officers, namely the Chief Financial Officer, the Chairman and
20		Vice Chairman of the Nation" (Resolution No. 190-88, veto overridden by Resolution
21		No. 191-88); and
22	WHEREAS,	as a matter of practice, the Nation has historically issued payroll, per diem, travel,
23		reimbursement, and other checks bearing the signatures of both the Nation's
24		Chairperson and Vice Chairperson; and
25	WHEREAS,	subsequent to the passage of Resolution No. 190-88, the Nation's Chief Financial
26		Officer position was eliminated; and
27	WHEREAS,	with the recent resignation of ViceChairmanNedNorris, Jr., there is noelectedofficial
28		currently authorized to serve as a second sign at ory on the Nation's checks as required
29		by law; and

RESOLUTION NO. 06-466 (Directing Development of Finance Code and Authorizing Officials to Sign Negotiable Instruments on the Nation's Behalf) Page 2 of 4 1 WHEREAS, the position of the Nation's Treasurer remains vacant and significant concerns have 2 been raised concerning the organization, staffing, and performance of the Office of the 3 Treasurer; and WHEREAS, it is essential to implement internal controls and establish clear lines of authority to 4 5 prevent incidents of fiscal mismanagement; and 6 WHEREAS, it is therefore in the Nation's best interest to amend Resolution No. 190-88 to identify 7 those officials who, in addition to the Nation's Chairperson, are vested with the 8 authority to sign the Nation's checks and other negotiable instruments; and 9 WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 83-88, "Adoption of Budget and Finance Committee's Plan 10 of Operation," the Legislative Council Budget and Finance Committee is delegated the 11 power to "review and recommend legislative measures or action to the Legislative $\textbf{Council} \dots \textbf{approving the expenditure of public funds or fiscal resources of the Nation"}$ 12 13 and measures or actions affecting "the establishment of bank accounts for, and the 14 deposit or expenditure of public monies" and funds (Plan of Operation, Section 15 1(b)(1)); and 16 WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee has consulted with the full Council, the Nation's 17 Chairwoman, and the Accounting Department concerning the need for authorizing 18 two officials to sign all checks issued by the Nation; and 19 WHEREAS, based on its review, the Budget and Finance Committee recommends that the Nation's 20 checks and other negotiable instruments bear the signature of both the Nation's 21 Chairperson and Vice Chairperson and that, in the event of a vacancy in the office of 22 the Nation's Vice Chairperson, that such instruments bear the signature of the 23 Chairperson of the Nation and the Chairperson of the Tohono O'odham Legislative 24 Council Budget and Finance Committee. 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Budget 26 and Finance Committee is directed, in consultation with the Accounting Department, 27 Office of the Treasurer, and the chief administrative officers of the Nation's three 28 branches of government, to develop a Finance Code to protect the Nation's financial 29 integrity while allowing business to be conducted in an efficient and timely manner.

RESOLUTION NO. 06-466 (Directing Development of Finance Code and Authorizing Officials to Sign Negotiable Instruments on the Nation's Behalf) Page 3 of 4 1 BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Finance Code shall2 contain provisions governing budget development, approval, and administration; 3 accounting and financial statements; procurement; Indian Preference in the 4 acquisition of goods and services; contracting; grant funding; audits and internal controls; signature authority, property management and disposal; and all other 5 6 matters the Budget and Finance Committee deems necessary. 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the second resolved 8 clause in Resolution No. 190-88 is hereby amended and replaced to read as follows: 9 "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that (1) any 10 funds of the Tohono O'odham Nation deposited in such accounts be subject to 11 withdrawal or charge at any time upon checks, notes, drafts, bills of exchange, 12 acceptances, undertakings or other instruments or orders for payment (collectively, 13 "negotiable instruments") when made, signed, drawn, accepted, or endorsed on 14 behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation by both the Nation's Chairperson and Vice 15 Chairperson, who shall be the designated signatories of the Nation for that purpose, 16 (2) in the event that the position of the Nation's Vice Chairman is vacant as defined 17 in the Constitution and laws of the Nation, the Chairperson of the Tohono O'odham 18 Legislative Council Budget and Finance Committee shall serve as the second 19 designated signatory of the Nation on negotiable instruments, and (3) the signature 20 of the two officials identified herein are required to constitute the authorized 21 signature of the Nation on any negotiable instruments issued by the Nation. 22 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby (1) ratifies the 23 signatures on checks issued by the Nation from June 28, 2006 at 2:00 p.m. until the 24 effective date of this Resolution and (2) authorizes the Nation's Chairwoman to act as 25 the sole signatory on checks issued by the Nation until such time that the second 26 signature authorized by this Resolution is implemented. 27 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 12^{TH} .
